#### 1. PRESENTATION OF ECPAR

## ECPAR is positioned as the Quebec benchmark and a leader in Canada

- Reduce greenhouse gas emissions
- Reduce at the source and ensure circularity of the material
- 3 Increase purchases from social economy enterprises (SEEs)
- 4 Calculate Total Cost of Ownership (TCO)
- Tracking /documenting the progress/impacts of sustainable procurement





#### 2.A METHODOLOGY

- The Barometer 2020 uses the methodology developed for the Barometer 2016, with the formula of 5 components, 20 indicators and 5 levels of performance.
- Organizations' practices are assessed using 20 indicators, each is associated with a variable number of questions in the questionnaire.
  - The 20 Barometer indicators are grouped into five components of sustainable procurement: vision, policy and governance, stakeholder engagement, operationalization and measurement.
  - The performance scale has five levels: little concerned, commitment, progress, maturity and exemplarity.

### 2.B PROFIL OF RESPONDENTS


- online on the ECPAR website.
- Our Canadian partners help mobilize a large number of Canadian organizations based on their respective networks of contacts.
- o In 2016, 76 organizations had participated in the Barometer. This year, 142 organizations took part.



#### 2.B PROFIL OF RESPONDENTS

- o 142 organizations participated in the Barometer
  - 26% companies; 26% organizations or ministries (Quebec and Canada); 26% municipalities; 11% educational networks.
  - 62% located in Quebec, 20% in Ontario, 9% in British Columbia, 4% in Alberta.

### 2.C OVERALL RESULTS

- They are the most advanced in terms of vision with a Progression level.
- The Little concerned level of maturity is observed for 4 indicators
- Maturity level is reached for the indicator accountability of hierarchical levels.

## 2.C Overall results

- Overall performance of organizations is stagnating compared to 2016.
  - O This observation is to be nuanced:
    - Significant increase in the number of respondents in 2020.
    - o Updating of the evaluation criteria based on the most recent procurement practices.
    - Requirement to provide supporting documents for levels 4 and 5, which make the Barometer more demanding.
- Organizations are committed, but the results of the Barometer indicate that there is still room for improvement in order to strengthen practices and make progress in sustainable procurement.
